Environment Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)

This is a nine credit environmental course package with specific grade 11 & 12 courses requirements. See www.satec.on.ca/SHSM for more information. A mandatory element of the Environment SHSM is the 2 credit co-op course. Students are strongly encouraged to complete co-op in grade 11.

ICT Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)

This is a nine credit information & communication technology course package with specific grade 11 & 12 courses requirements. See www.satec.on.ca/SHSM for more information. A mandatory element of the ICT SHSM is the 2 credit co-op course. Students are strongly encouraged to complete co-op in grade 11.

Dual Credit College Courses – Students intending on college as their post-secondary pathway have an opportunity to enroll in a college course held at one of 4 participating colleges in Toronto one afternoon per week. The Dual Credit Program is best facilitated by students when they also select a 2 or 4 credit co-op course. See your Guidance Counsellor for more details.
